- Serve** Him in His Kingdom.

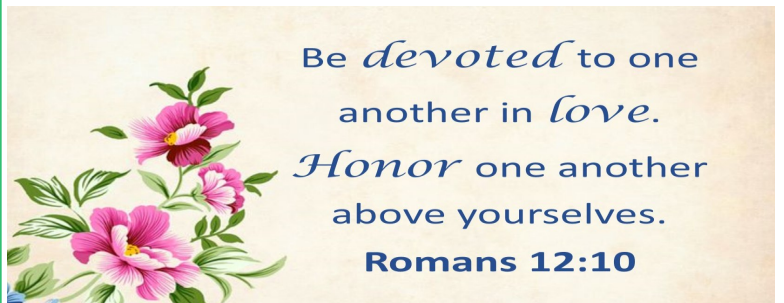

Life Thoughts Via Lutherans For Life...

May 17 – Seventh Sunday of Easter – “Sing to God, sing praises to His name; lift up a song to Him who rides through the deserts!” (Psalm 68:4). What a wonderful picture of Christ, God-in-the-flesh, who entered the desert wilderness of this world to bring light into the darkness and life to the dead! In a world that fosters a culture of death, Jesus came to give us eternal life. In Him, grace and peace rain down in abundance (Psalm 68:9). What hope this brings to those who are suffering, facing an unexpected pregnancy, or have lost their mooring in life! Christ brings forgiveness and restoration. Although we endure fiery trials (1 Peter 4:12), and the devil prowls like a roaring lion, seeking to devour (1 Peter 5:8-9), yet by the power of God’s Word, we resist him, firm in the faith. We are blessed as we follow Jesus, who suffered once for all on the cross, accomplishing the work that the Father gave Him to do (John 17:4).  Saturday, June 20, 2026 at 3:00 p.m.

The concert features Mr. Richard C. Ewert on the Church’s digitally enhanced Casavant Pipe organ and Dr. Aaron Wunsch, Professor of Keyboard Studies at the Juilliard School in New York City, on its classic Steinway Piano. Concert selections incorporate organ and piano favorites and will feature a rare live performance of the Concerto for Organ and Piano (Op. 74) composed by the Belgian organist Flor Peeters in 1951. Peeters taught famed American organist Paul Manz, whose musical influence in turn shaped Mr. Ewert’s approach to creative hymn accompaniments. Popular piano and organ solo performances include George Gershwin’s *Rhapsody in Blue* and Charles Ives “Variations on ‘America,’” in honor of the celebration of the 250th Anniversary of American Independence on July 4th. The concert concludes with the singing of two hymns appropriate to the occasion.

A reception will be held afterwards in the fellowship hall for the artists and their families. Admission is free and open to the public; free will donations will be received. Contact the church office for more information: 262-797-2970 or ASTroh@egl.org.
