Life Thoughts Via Lutherans For Life...

May 24 – The Day of Pentecost – The Holy Spirit, like streams of living water (John 37:38), flows forth from Christ, just as the blood and water flowed forth from His side when He was pierced on the cross. The Spirit brings life. The Spirit gives birth to the New Testament Church, which proclaims the message of abundant and eternal life in Christ crucified and risen (Acts 2:1-4). The Spirit makes us to know God’s ways and teaches us His paths. He leads the humble in what is right (Psalm 25:4-5, 9). He enables us to share the Good News of Life with those who are troubled or afraid, that they may know that they do not face life’s crises alone. As the Spirit rested on Eldad and Medad (Numbers 11:26) and rested on the heads of the apostles on the day of Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4), so the Holy Spirit emboldens us to be Gospel-motivated voices for Life in an otherwise dark and frightening world.

 Saturday, June 20, 2026 at 3:00 p.m.

The concert features Mr. Richard C. Ewert on the Church’s digitally enhanced Casavant Pipe organ and Dr. Aaron Wunsch, Professor of Keyboard Studies at the Juilliard School in New York City, on its classic Steinway Piano. Concert selections incorporate organ and piano favorites and will feature a rare live performance of the Concerto for Organ and Piano (Op. 74) composed by the Belgian organist Flor Peeters in 1951. Peeters taught famed American organist Paul Manz, whose musical influence in turn shaped Mr. Ewert’s approach to creative hymn accompaniments. Popular piano and organ solo performances include George Gershwin’s *Rhapsody in Blue* and Charles Ives “Variations on ‘America,’” in honor of the celebration of the 250th Anniversary of American Independence on July 4th. The concert concludes with the singing of two hymns appropriate to the occasion.

A reception will be held afterwards in the fellowship hall for the artists and their families. Admission is free and open to the public; free will donations will be received. Contact the church office for more information: 262-797-2970 or ASTroh@egl.org.
